Summer grant cycle awards announced

HILLSDALE — The Hillsdale County Community Foundation recently announced the recipients of the most recent general grant cycle.

A total of \$35,047 was awarded to area non-profit organizations for projects or programs to benefit a large number of Hillsdale County residents.

The following organizations were awarded funding through the Hillsdale County Community Foundation General Endowment Fund:

- Artworks of Hillsdale, \$5,000 for the Heritage Association Winona Statue Project;

- Child Abuse Prevention and Awareness, \$3,900 for advertising for a safe sleep campaign;

- Community Action Agency, \$13,510 for “Getting Ahead in a Just Getting By World” classes;

- Highfields, Inc., \$2,000 for unmet needs for clients and families;

- Hillsdale College, \$4,287 for projects at Slayton Arboretum;

- Hillsdale Conservation District, \$1,500 for advertising for scrap tire collection;

- Moscow Township Fire and Rescue, a matching



grant up to \$3,300 for extraction equipment; and

- SMART Recovery, \$1,550 for addition support group meetings.
