'Safe, Sound and Secure' conference on Aug. 21

The annual "Seniors: Safe, Sound and Secure" conference will take place from 9 a.m. until 2 p.m. Friday, Aug. 21, at the Lenawee Intermediate School District Tech Center, 1372 N. Main St. It is a free seminar for Lenawee County older adults to learn ways to protect themselves, their money, insurance and personal information.

Topics to be discussed include Probate Court issues; pre-pay versus pre-plan funerals; protecting health insurance information; current scams; and hospital and nursing home rights.

A representative from the Lenawee County Substance Abuse Prevention Coalition will talk about the "Big Red Barrel" project. A red barrel will be available to dispose of unwanted medications. Pill-form medications only are accepted.

A light breakfast, lunch will be available and door prizes will be given away.

The event is sponsored by the Region 2 Area Agency on Aging and the Triad of Lenawee. The board of directors is made up of members from the Lenawee County Sheriff's Office, Adrian Police Department, Lenawee County Board of Commissioners, Michigan State Police, Tecumseh Police Department, the Better Business Bureau, Hospice of Lenawee, Lenawee County Department on Aging, the Social Security Administration and Seniors Advocate.
